


Kitten Charter

At Petplan our aim is to provide an efficient and friendly service, valuable to both breeders and kitten buyers.



As we cannot visit all breeders and their facilities, we have established the following Breeder Charter. We rely on breeders to comply with all aspects of the Charter:

- 1 I am the breeder and owner of the litter.
- 2 If the kitten is a pedigree both the sire and dam are registered with the GCCF or another official organisation.
- 3 I breed from no more than 3 breeds of cat.
- 4 I am satisfied that all the kittens for sale:
 - Are in good health and have not knowingly been exposed to any infections or contagious diseases, eg. ringworm, during the six weeks prior to sale.
 - Show no sign of congenital condition or infirmity.
 - Show no sign of infestation by fleas or ear mites.

- 5 If a kitten in the litter shows any defect which is likely to have an impact on health, I will explain this to the purchaser prior to sale (including any male kitten that does not have both testicles descended into the scrotum). If the kitten is to be used for breeding and/or showing then I will make the purchaser aware if the kitten shows any of the defects listed in the preface to the GCCF Standard of Points or shows any colour or pattern defects listed in the Standard for the breed of cat.
- 6 Conventional (i.e. not homeopathic) vaccinations will be used. All kittens sold at 12 weeks will have been fully vaccinated. A certificate to this effect signed by the veterinary surgeon will be handed to the purchaser, I will keep the kitten for 24 hours after its second vaccination.
- 7 All kittens will have been wormed before sale and I will provide the purchaser with a certificate showing the date of worming and the preparation used.
- 8 If the kitten is a pedigree I will provide a completed and signed pedigree form. It will show three generations, detailing where possible, breed numbers and registration numbers.
- 9 A feeding chart will be supplied.
